


• Think about your own personal "growing up" family origin stories



- The ancient Middle-Eastern peoples would not know what this picture represented
- For them, the earth was flat and they weren't asking scientific structural questions
- What questions were the ancient peoples seeking answers to about the world in which they lived? What questions are you seeking answers to in this modern world?
- As we reflect upon the Genesis origin stories, we must read the text and try to observe what questions the author was attempting to answer from his/her own cultural worldview.





- This is how the Ancient Israelites viewed the world, which is similar to how ALL people viewed the world in ancient times
- The following Babylonian creation story is also similar to those of surrounding nations




 As you read this story, focus on the main characters and their involvement in the creation story




PEOPLE OF THE LAND




- Did you notice the conflict between the gods, their extreme violence, the reason for human's being created, and the hierarchal leadership position of Marduk
- Did you notice how the story mirrors the hierarchical domination structure of the Ancient Near-Eastern Cosmology diagram on page 4?




- Note the line between verse 1 where God creates ex-nihilo (out of nothing) and verse 2 onwards where God brings order out of chaos (formless, empty, darkness) = two different origin stories (origin of material world vs origin of a functional world)
- Each day's creative work is "good"




 Note how God gives agency to all that he is creating (the land produces fruitfulness according to each one's kind) and it is all "good"




• Note how God forms "time" and it is "good"




• Again, note the God-given agency and abundance of the ordered creation




- Again, creative agency of animals which is good
- Then creation of human beings in God's image which is "very good"
- God blesses humanity and imparts a divine mandate, privilege and responsibility to be the benevolent overseers, custodians, stewards, servant-leaders over the created order
- The Hebrew verb literally means to rule by going down and walking among the subjects as an equal.



- Dr Walton suggests that the Genesis origin story is more about God ordering the functional elements of time, weather and food (out of chaos), rather than it being focused on God creating a material world
- Do you agree or disagree? Why?



- Note how different the ending of this Genesis origin story is to the Babylonian origin story
- List the ways it is different.
- How does this influence the way we think of God, ourselves and the world in which we live?




- Where is God in this Second Creation Story and how does He interact with humans?

- See especially the interconnectedness of nature, humans & God in this story



- Dr Walton suggests that the Hebrew Creation Story is more like a "home story" (answering functional ordered relationship questions) rather than a "house story" (answering scientific material origin questions)
- Discuss...



- A Home Story where we are honoured guests is significantly different than a House Story where we are insignificant... reflect on this in relation to the Genesis Origin Story as a functional ordering story rather than a structural material creation story
- Do you view this world as a just a house or your home?



- Jesus came and "tabernacled" amongst us; He is "Immanuel" (God with us) and promised that he would be with us till the end of the age; He promised His disciples that he was going to prepare a place for them
- As you commune with God, remember Jesus' death on a cruel cross and all that it reveals about the nature of God, His love for us and what He accomplished in restoring relationship with all creation
